

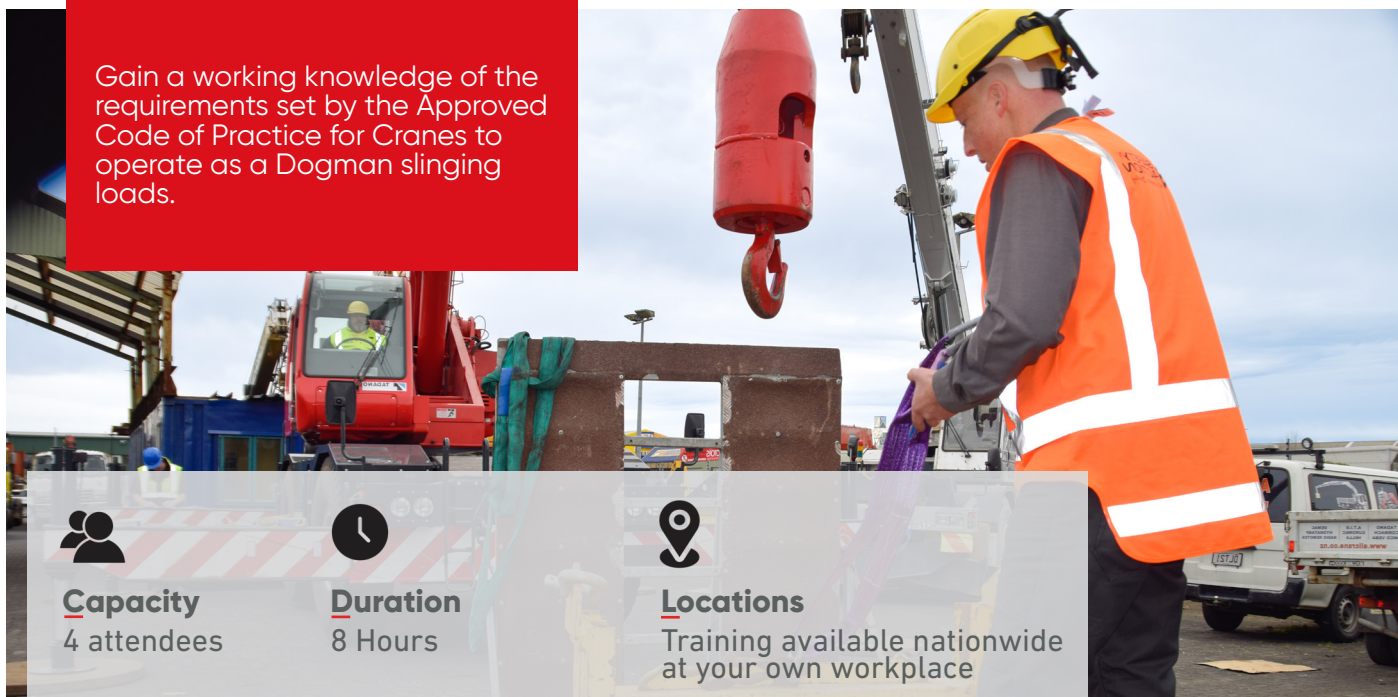

Prerequisites

Experience Required: Verified experiences using one or more of the following proving experiences: authorised verifier documented observed lifts, company documents. Minimum of 40 lifts (slinging and directing placement of load) with at least six variations of lifting operations that may include site, crane, loads, and communication methods.

This documentation can be sent in at time of booking, ahead of training or post training.
